Dear Members

Once again the end of the year is upon us and if anyone knows how to stop the rains it would be a good time to step forward. The damage to the reserve and the channel from the weather events have been ongoing.

I would like to thank all our volunteer ramp wardens. In fact, we all owe a big thank you to our ramp wardens. These guys are the ones who make the ramp run smoothly – far too often without thanks from the users. They are the ones that give up their fishing days to make your lives easier at the ramp. They are often willing to give fishing advice (where to fish) and hold your boat when they aren't too busy.

After several months of having no honesty box a new one has been made and erected beside the ramp.

Last year we reduced our standard membership fee to \$50. As a result of this reduction, we have seen a massive increase in memberships. At the time of writing this newsletter we had 1975 members, an increase of around 600 on last year. Our launchings are remaining fairly static which indicates that a lot of day users have converted to members.

As noted above, the weather has not been kind to us this year. It was our goal to repair holes in the parking area but this has not been achievable and with the continued wet weather our roads have also suffered. We are looking at clearing the back of the ramp after the next rain system has cleared but will not dredge the entire river until September. I have continued to put videos out on social media advising the state of the channel.

Despite repairing the potholes in the access road several times this year, people are continuing to drive too fast in the reserve and the potholes are reappearing again quickly. Please ensure you keep your speed down to 5km/h in the reserve to minimise the damage to the roading.

Our AGM this year is on Sunday the 23rd July at the Thames Sailing Club at Tararu starting at 10 am sharp. This is a good time to raise any issues or concerns you have with your committee. If you are unable to attend please contact us via email on wbrs2000@gmail.com if you have anything you would like discussed in general business. Where possible, we will answer these on the day as well as follow up by return email.

Our financials will be posted on the website prior to the AGM. With one exception (Membership Secretary), the officers and committee have indicated they intend to stand again. Although last year I indicated that I would likely stand down this year, my intention is to stand again and continue to maintain the relationship with Iwi. I look forward to seeing you at the AGM.
